THE POWER OF INTERNATIONAL EDUCATION SET TO TAKE CENTRE STAGE AT AIEC 2025

This week, leaders from across the international education sector will come together at the Australian International Education Conference (AIEC) to address one of the most dynamic and unpredictable periods in the industry's history. Co-hosted by IDP Education and the International Education Association of Australia (IEAA), the event will serve as a forum to connect, collaborate and explore ideas for the future of the industry.

AIEC 2025 will be held in Canberra at the National Convention Centre, running from Tuesday 21 to Friday 24 October. This year's conference is centred on the theme "*Navigating Change*". The program will examine how international educators, sector professionals and organisations can adapt to evolving circumstances, strengthen resilience, and leverage change as a driver for innovation and opportunity.

"Right now, our sector is navigating complex challenges but also has a chance to redefine how we support students and demonstrate the value we bring to economies, workplaces and societies."

IEAA Chief Executive Officer, Phil Honeywood, said AIEC 2025 will be one of the most significant gatherings in the conference's history.

"The Australian higher education sector stands at a turning point. Beyond the current domestic policy reforms, we are seeing profound shifts in global politics, student mobility and education technology," Mr Honeywood said.

"This year's conference will not only unpack these issues but also reinforce the collaborative spirit that has sustained our sector through decades of change."

"IEAA is proud to build upon and amplify the successes and expertise of industry experts through AIEC. With our partners and international education providers, we will work to ensure that AIEC 2025 continues to play a key role when it comes to raising our industry's voice, making a positive difference for years to come."

The four-day event will feature keynote presentations, panel discussions, workshops and informal networking sessions. Delegates will hear from local and international experts on topics including the future of international student markets, sustainable education models, the role of artificial intelligence, and the evolving regulatory environment.
