

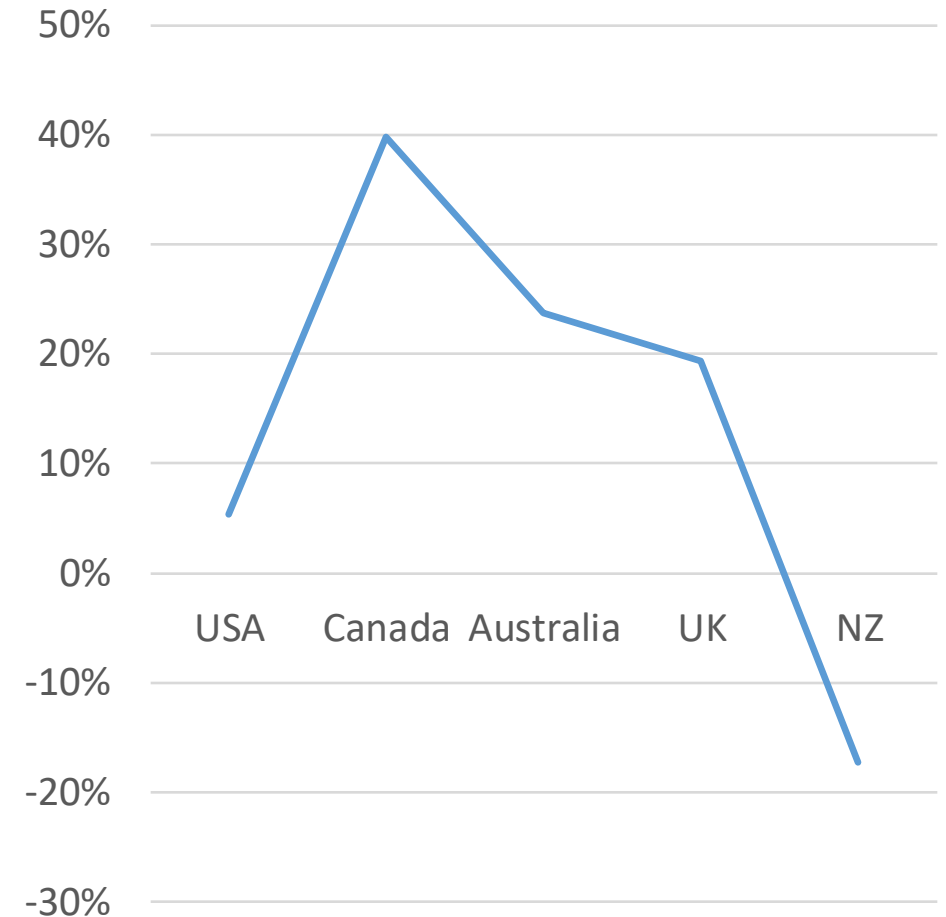

India's Priorities for Education Reform

- Address access
 - Expanding enrolment targets, IITs double seats
 - 70 new centrally-funded institutions in 10 years
 - Expanding online programs
- Achieve world-class education
 - 20 Indian institutions in the world top 100 by 2030
 - Connect higher education to society's problems
 - Increase industry investment in higher education
- Attract international students
 - Develop India as an educational hub

Building Research Expertise

- Indian Government funded schemes
 - New major National Research Fund
 - Funding for foreign faculty and research exchange
 - Research infrastructure investment

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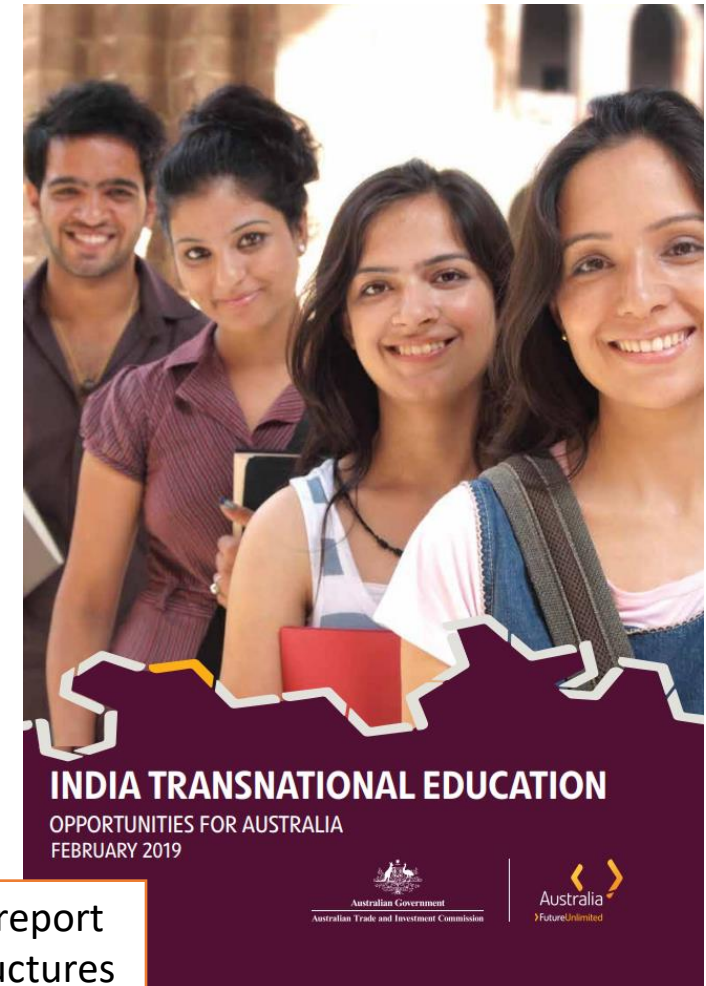

Transnational education policies

- Increased openness to foreign collaboration for highest ranked Indian institutes
 - Twinning/articulation
 - Joint PhDs
- Online education policies restricted to local providers
- Increase in Australian providers looking for industry engagement and partnerships

Continuing qualifications recognition

- India's approach to qualifications recognition remains case-by-case
- India aims to make improvements to quality assurance mechanisms
- In 2019, the Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) agreed to recognise credits earned through Sub-Bachelor 'Pathway' Programs in Australia
 - Criteria:
 - Australian universities take responsibility of quality of credits earned through a pathway provider in Australia
 - Australian universities reflect credits as part of the university transcript (without referring to 'pathway')
 - Only applies for credits earned in Australia
