### Scene setting

- "The rates of violence experienced by young people are a call to action for Australian universities. Every young person who is contemplating a university education is entitled to expect that they will be able to study in an environment that is safe and promotes their well-being."
- Change the Course: National Report on Sexual Assault and Sexual Harassment at Australian Universities (2017)
- Change the Course: Australian institutions are grappling with unacceptably high rates of sexual violence on our campuses and in our communities
- What does this mean for the Learning Abroad Sector?
- Growth in learning abroad participation has been significant:
  - nearly 50,000 Australian students had an overseas study experience in 2017 (up 11.8% on 2016)
  - 1 in 5 Australian undergraduate students undertook study in an overseas country in 2017 (Olsen, AUIDF 2018)
