

International education experts gather in Perth to lead the sector into the future

The Hon. Julie Bishop and the Hon. Kim Beazley AC will join world-leading education experts in Perth this week to discuss the future of Australia's third largest export sector at the Australian International Education Conference (AIEC).

More than 1,500 delegates will be part of discussions that push the sector to address critical challenges and opportunities, including shifts in global mobility, disruptions to learning models and international and domestic policy changes.

Co-hosted by IDP Education and International Education Association of Australia (IEAA), the conference will also discuss how to best support students and international education professionals in their development of leadership qualities and how to foster greater collaboration within the sector.

IEAA will also release a major report looking at *Economic opportunities and outcomes of post-study work rights in Australia* – which presents some of the most detailed research of its kind, drawing on the Australian Census and Temporary Entrants Integrated Dataset (ACTEID) 2016.
