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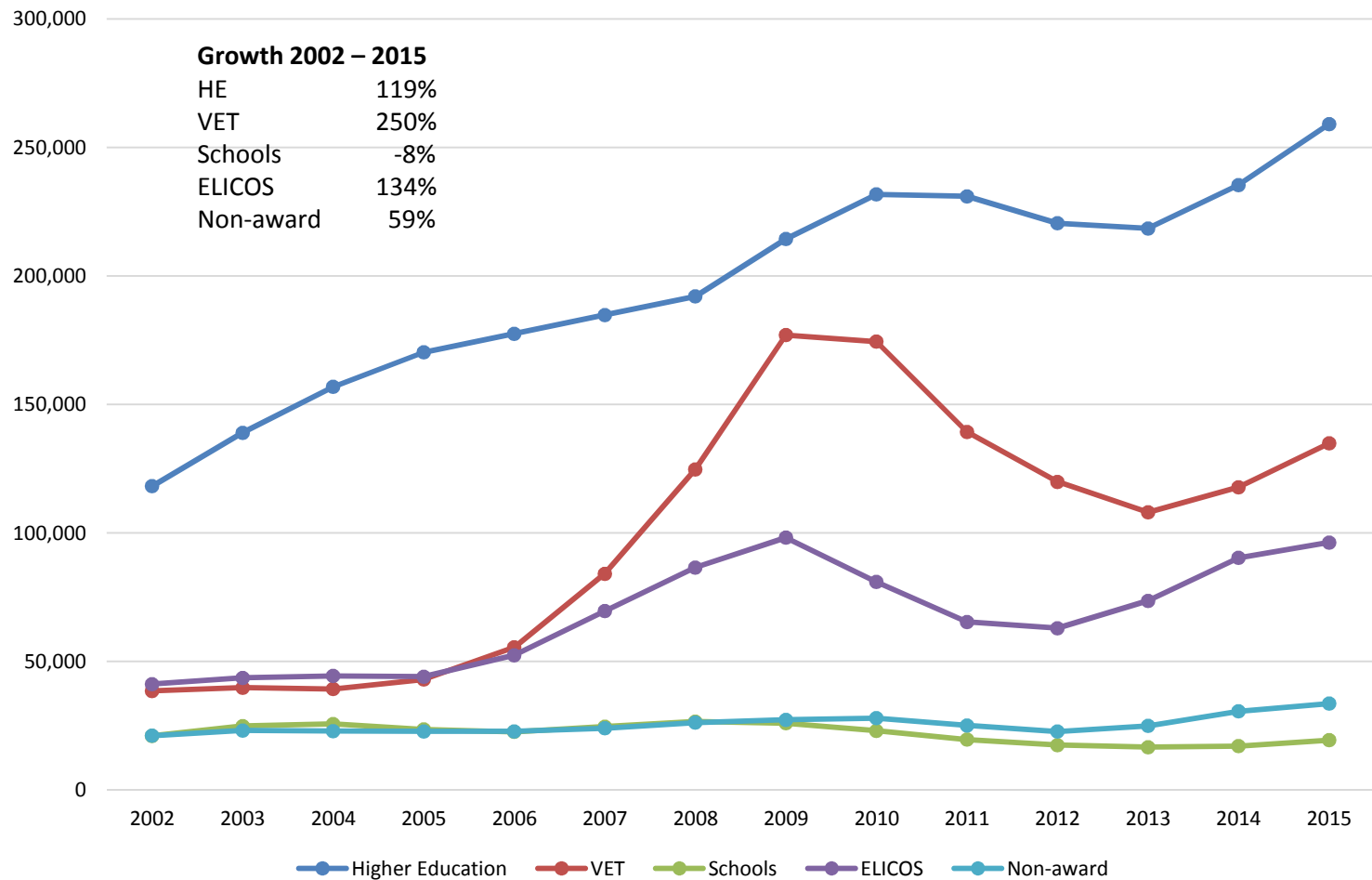
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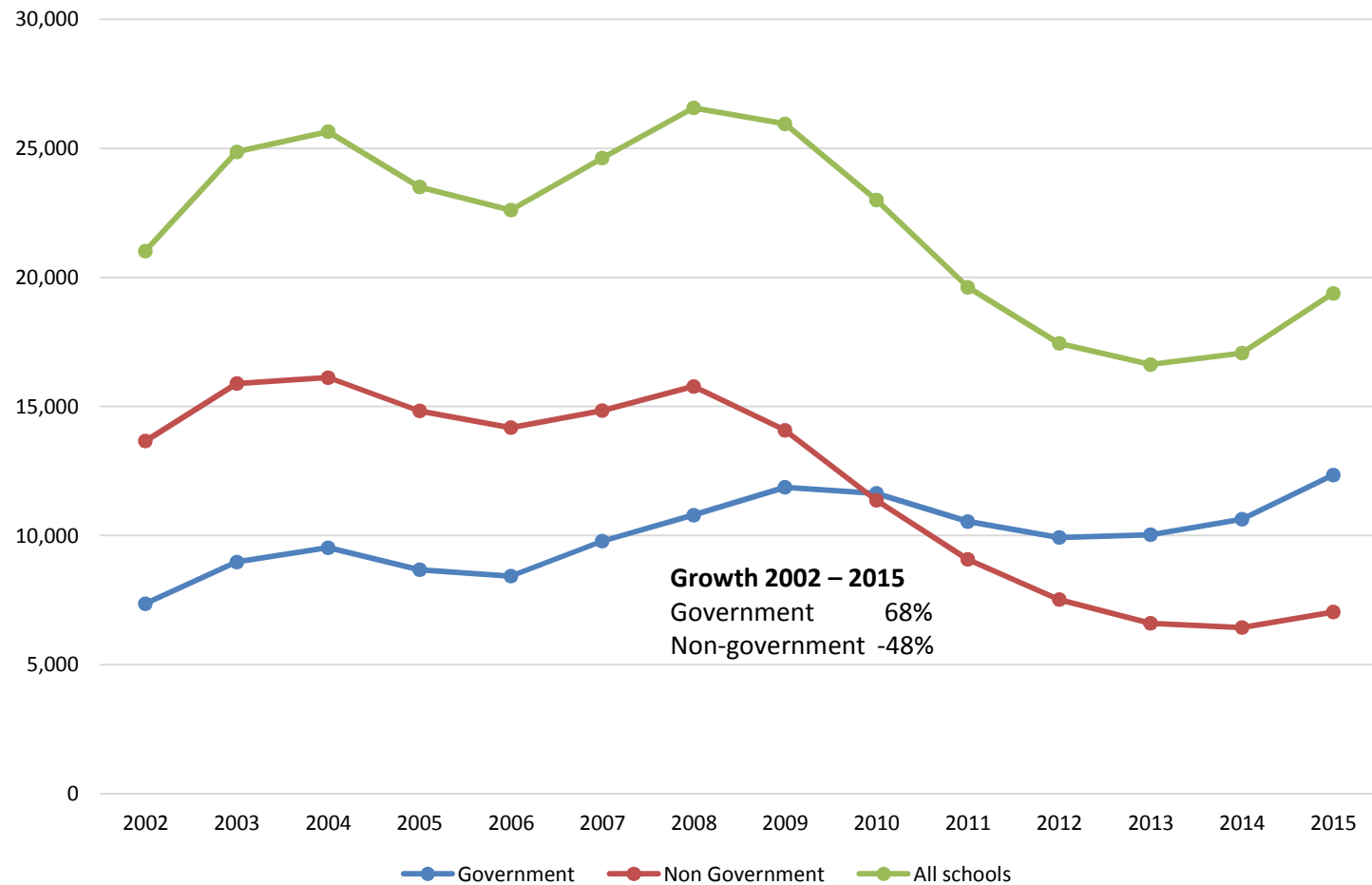
Enrolment growth in student visa holders by sector 2002 - 2015

Domestic compliance requirements for non-government schools

- As schools
 - State-based school registration and associated reporting accountability requirements
 - Reporting and accountability requirements of the Commonwealth Australian Education Act
- As legal entities and as charities
 - ACNC
 - Registrar of Associations (S/T)
 - ASIC / ATO

Domestic compliance requirements for non-government schools cont.

- As employers
 - equal employment opportunity
 - industrial awards
 - occupational health and safety
- As educational institutions
 - health
 - safety
 - Privacy
 - child protection (blue card etc)
 - accommodation / boarding

Compliance requirements for CRICOS registered non-government schools

- State-based CRICOS registration
- Educational Services for Overseas Students (ESOS) Act 2000
- Tuition Protection Service
- National Code
- ASQA – for dual sector VET providers or schools registered as RTOs

Student Visa Program

- Closely linked to ESOS and the National Code
- Welfare for under-18s
- Reporting of students
- Student Guardian visa holders
- New Simplified Student Visa Framework (SSVF) will incorporate 'provider risk'
