



# **Auckland perspective**

### **Advantages**

- Shared interests research, student programming, etc.
- Benchmarking

### Lessons

- Needs buy-in from staff and leadership

### **Diversity**

- Largest Pacific City in the world
- 48% Aucklanders born elsewhere
- 7% Maori and 8% Pacific Islander
- University of Auckland staff similarly diverse in origin – driving international collaboration, enabled by network participation and funding
- Outbound student mobility is supported by \$50,000 scholarship funding for target cohorts ion addition to \$26,000 for network participation
