

Terms

- FAFSA—Free Application for Federal Student Aid
- EFC—Expected Family Contribution
- COA/COP—Cost of Attendance/Cost of Participation
- Big 10—14 Research 1 Institutions Consortium (mostly Midwestern US, but some East Coast)
- Pell Grant--A grant that does not need to be repaid and is reserved for students with high financial needs and a low EFC



Financial Aid Preview Meeting

- A "preview" of your aid package before applying or confirming in a program – is it a good fit financially?

 - Current aid compared with COP
 - Scholarships
 - o Aid options for any gap in costs (PLUS/Private Loan)
 - Billing process/timing

Other financial aid considerations

- Pell Eligible students
 - Big 10 numbers (2,615* Pell students studied abroad last year)
 - University of Minnesota had 466*
- Bridging Loans
 - For students that are Pell Eligible, money covering up front costs (deposits and airfare).
- Fund the Gap
 - Pilot program with President's Emerging Scholars students, the Learning Abroad Center will fund the gap between tuition on campus and program fees abroad (up to \$6000)



Scholarships

- Non need or merit based (\$1000-\$4000)
- Diversity Scholarships (\$1000-\$4000)
- Financial Need Scholarships (\$1500-\$4500)
 - Planning scholarship
